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The Best Beaches in Costa Rica

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Costa Rica is famous for beautiful beaches. With coastlines on the Pacific and Caribbean, it's home to some of the best PLAYAS in the world. Golden sand shaded by palm trees and powdery white sand surrounded by offshore corals. You can enjoy sublime sunrises and Pacific beaches that glow with fiery sunsets!

I am going to list my top 11 choices for the BEST beaches in Costa Rica:

1. Manuel Antonio Beach - Everything people love about Costa Rica with spectacular beaches, calm turquoise water, lush rainforest and abundant wildlife. \$16 per person if you are not a local to enter, allowing you to see the wildlife and visit the 3-4 beaches in Manuel Antonio National Park. The park beaches are much more tranquil than the free beaches in the area because there are no vendors and much less populated due to the entrance fee. If you leave your bag unattended on the beach and have food in it, the monkeys will come out of the forest, look through it, and steal your food from you :)

2. **Playa Ventanas** - Playa Ventanas (Windows Beach) gets it's name from the beautiful sea caves that line the north and south ends of the beach. The two caves on the north end extend from the beach out to the ocean, which is a distance of about 50 meters. Absolutely spectacular!

3. **Playa Ballena** - Bahia Ballena is located just 15 minutes south of the more well-known surf town, Dominical, and is a breath of fresh air for travelers looking to enjoy the natural beauty of the Southern Pacific region, as well as the laid-back charm of a small, authentic Tico town. Bahia Ballena, which literally means "Whale Bay", has its name for two reasons:

A. At low tide the sandbar on the north end of the Ballena Marine National Park beach forms into what from above looks like a giant whale's tail, aka the Whale's Tail.

B. It provides the perfect place for whales from both the north and south to give birth; for this reason, there are actually whale watching seasons in this lucky town. surfing waves, laid back lifestyle and beautiful landscapes, Dominical captures the essence of an old Costa Rican beach town and continues to captivate the many visitors that come every year. Dominical is one of the top surfing beaches in Costa Rica, attracting people from all over the world looking for a laid-back beach town to catch waves.

5. **Playa Tamarindo** - Picture a tropical paradise and you're likely thinking of somewhere that resembles Tamarindo. You will be busy soaking in the bright sunshine and splashing around in the stunning turquoise water. Those looking to dive in the water can just head to the beach with a towel and have a day filled with fun swimming. Those that are more adventurous can rent scuba gear and spend the day exploring what is underneath the surface of the pristine water.

6. **Playa Teresa** - With stunning white sand beaches, reliable surfing waves and a laid-back vibe you will love this beach. The sun-warmed clear water ranges from kneedeep to about chest-deep and is filled with all kinds of interesting sea creatures that get trapped when the tide goes out. You can find sea anemones, sea stars, crabs, mussels, hermit crabs and lots of little brightly colored fish. Rocks and volcanic reef create the structure around the tide pool. Since the water is shallow and it's right off the beach, this is a perfect swimming and snorkeling site for everyone.

7. **Malpais** - offers rocky coves, white sand beaches, waterfalls, rainforests, surfing, and relaxation near a remote fishing village and Cabo Blanco National Park. The prime attraction is surfing at beaches. There is fishing, boating, snorkeling, diving, hiking, horseback riding, biking, and 4-wheel drive touring. A 4-wheel drive vehicle comes in handy for navigating unpaved roads in this still mostly wild area, particularly during the rainy season.

8. **Playa Hermosa** - Hermosa, which means "beautiful" in Spanish, is an aptly named gray-sand beach that perches between two mountains. It is a fabulous getaway for those seeking quality relaxation.

9. **Playa Blanca**- Playa Blanca has pristine white sand and alluring water. This is a welcome oasis. Plenty of trees for shade, free loungers (if you're early); picnic and BBQ

spots, warm clear water, rocks pools at low tide for the snorkelers.

10. **Playa Samara** - The ocean here is shallow, and the waves are present enough to learn to surf but unforgiving enough to enjoy a day splashing around in them. After a day in the waves, there are sunset beach lounges with mellow music, creative cocktails and international cuisine. The magical sunsets during our stay turned the sky various shades of purple and pink, causing a wall of bikini-clad amateur paparazzi to form, trying to capture the stunning scenery.

11. **Ostional Wild Life Refuge** -Turtle Hatching- One of the two most important areas in the world for nesting of the Olive Ridley turtle. This is the place for nearly guaranteed Costa Rica turtle watching. Every year, millions of sea turtles lumber onto the beaches of Ostional National Wildlife Refuge. Every year, millions of sea turtles are born on the beaches of Ostional Wildlife Refuge. And every year, thousands of lucky visitors come to these beaches to witness this spectacular event!







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Lipstick Palm of Costa

Who hasn't lusted after this tropical beauty, with its scarlet crownshaft and petioles, red as sealing wax. Frustratingly, they grow like weeds in South-East Asia and Costa Rica, yet are so rarely available elsewhere. The small seeds germinate rapidly, and the subsequent seedlings show color from quite a young age. These palms require tropical conditions, such as in Costa Rica, but will also grow happily in the greenhouse or conservatory.



Also known as red palm or red sealing wax palm, lipstick palm (Cyrtostachys renda) is appropriately named for its distinctive, bright red fronds and trunk. Lipstick palm is considered by many to be one of the world's most beautiful and exotic palms. Lipstick palm growing conditions includes partial shade while the plant is young. Otherwise, mature trees thrive in full sunlight. This warm climate tree prefers year round temperatures between 75 and 85 F. (24-29 C.). Red sealing wax palm doesn't grow well in dry soil and isn't tolerant of strong winds. It requires high humidity and even grows in swampy conditions or standing water, making this palm a useful pond plant. Although lipstick palm can be started by seed,

it's much easier and faster to remove and replant suckers from the side of an established tree. If you're adventurous and want to try your hand at growing lipstick palm from seeds, remove dry seedheads from a plant, then remove the seeds and plant them in a planting media with excellent moisture retention. Germination generally takes at least two to four months, and seeds may not sprout for up to nine months.

Where to Go Birding in Costa Rica

Where to go birding? It's a perennial question for those of us who want to lay eyes on some avian life forms. Do we just keep it simple and stare out the back window? Do we bundle up and head to the nearest reservoir, or a favorite park? Maybe a wildlife refuge or nature preserve? Or, do we make that bleary eyed trip to a place where we stand in various lines and pay for overpriced snacks so we can cover large distances in a matter of hours? All that waiting and annoyance so we can see a big new suite of birds?

Plate-billed Mountain-Toucan. Resplendent Quetzal. Blue-and-gold Tanager. Just a few birds with justifiable fancy names and unless you live in Ecuador, Colombia, or Central America, plane travel is more or less required to meet them in their feathered persons. In my opinion, oh it is definitely worth the long ride (!) but even after exiting the airport in a brand new birdy country, we still need to know where we need to go to see those and other species.

Back in the days of fewer people and more habitat, finding birds was probably as easy as pie. Can you imagine going birding in the hardwood forests of the eastern United States or Canada or Britain oh say 300 years ago? As long as the local people allowed birding on their land, you wouldn't need any information on where to find birds because they would have been everywhere. An abundance of shorebirds in the wetlands, multitudes of wood-warblers, vireos, and other songbirds doing their vocal thing from the woodland mosaic. Prairies and other naturally open habitats bubbling with longspurs, meadowlarks, and other species of the grass. By historical accounts and the much greater degree of intact habitat, we know there

used to be a lot more birds, like millions and millions more.

The situation in Costa Rica would have been just as or even more birdy. A constant flow of avian activity ebbing through mature tropical forests from the hot and humid lowlands up into the cool, high mountains. The logistics would have been tougher than a triathalon but the birds would have been everywhere because there was intact habitat everywhere and therein lies the key to finding birds no matter where you bring the bins. Roads made things easier for birding but they also came with a hefty price.

Cut a road through forest and it becomes an avenue of invitation for logging, hunting, and turning bastions of biodiversity into hot cow pasture. Although protecting the lands along roads can prevent such destruction, roadside preserves are much more the objection to the common rule. As with most places on the planet, in Costa Rica, roads followed that typical plan of deforestation leading to pasture or ag. lands long before anyone gave a hoot about cutting down trees. Fortunately, before the entire place was shorn of centenarian trees, protections were put into place to preserve watersheds and biodiversity and this is why, in Costa Rica, we can still drive through cloud forest, take a road to mature lowland rainforest, and drive around and visit several distinct habitats with some fantastic roadside birding. Since there are so many good places to go birding, it really is hard to think of the must-visit Palo Verde National Park sites, the places that host the most. However, if I had to settle on three of the best sites for each habitat and biogeographic region, this is what comes to mind:

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Costa Rica is Noted for Amazing Biodiversity

Costa Rica is one of the most biodiverse countries in the world – you can find nearly 5 percent of all known plants and animal species in its national parks and wildlife refuges. ... Some of Costa Rica's national parks have bird species that you can see very few places in the world. In fact Costa Rica has more species of birds than the US and Canada combined. This is because it is a migratory destination for both North American and South America.

Costa Rica's biodiversity is attributed to the dramatic shifts in terrain — this tiny country has wetlands, mountains, rivers, and arid plains. You can find many different types of forests here, including tropical dry forests, rainforests, and cloud forests. There are mountain ranges, some of which are studded with volcanoes.

While you're here you'll see evidence of Costa Rica's commitment to protecting its wildlife. Deforestation was a major problem in the 20th century, but organizations in Costa Rica are committed to planting trees and a host of other efforts to offset carbon footprints. Well maintained parks and knowledgeable guides make it easy to appreciate Costa Rica's wildlife.

Costa Rica channels funds from a fuel tax, car stamp duty and energy fees to pay for nature reserve management and environmental services like clean air, fresh water and biodiversity protection.

Landowners are paid to preserve old-growth forests and to plant new trees. As a result, forest cover has risen from 24% in 1985 to close to 46% today.

It has also established a national commission on biodiversity, comprising scientists, civil servants and indigenous representatives, which proposes policies to the government and promotes green education among the public.

The Certificate for Sustainable Tourism (CST) is another step in the right direction. CST is a certification program that evaluates businesses for sustainable practices. The CST rates companies from 0 to 5 based upon their degree of environmental, social and economic involvement. Higher ratings are given to businesses that successfully balance the impact of their activities. The program is voluntary but rigorous. Evidence is presented on over 100 practices involving community, the environment, and labor - before a business is given a CST rating. These ratings help visitors to Costa Rica make educated purchasing decisions.
